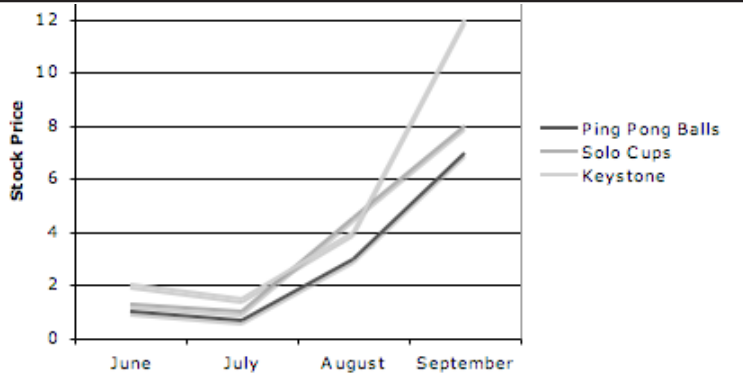


Table 1: Stock Prices of Cups, Balls, and Beer for June-September
