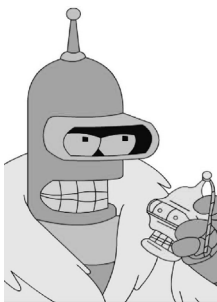
NOW IN THE HAMILTON COLLEGE BOOKSTORE: SEX ROBOTS!

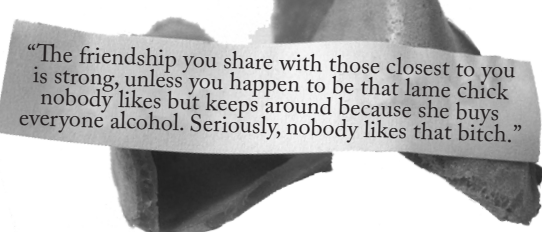
Erikson added, "But speaking of that, Goddamn it, it's fucking cold up here."

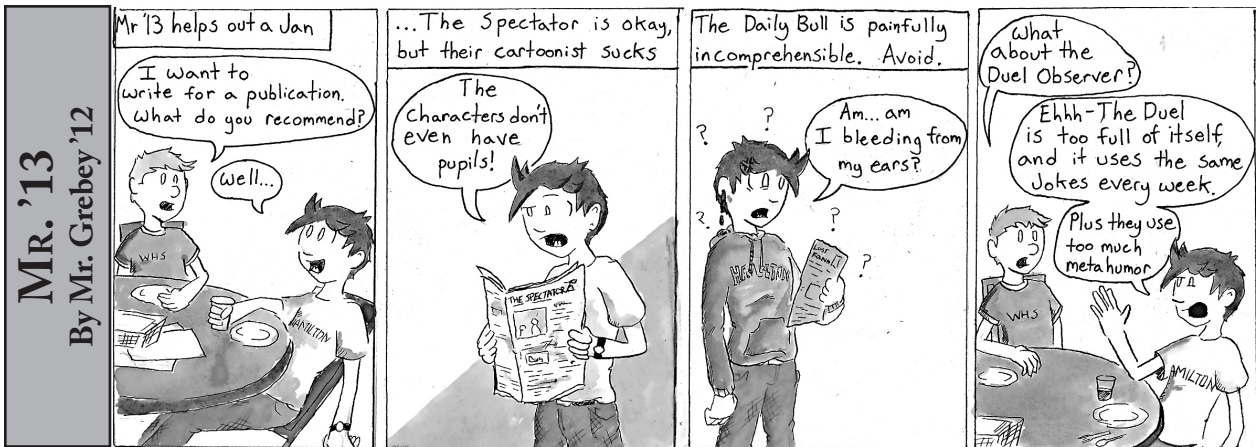

Print a long blank document off Word. Then steal the pages for your dorm room printer. It's what we like to call killing two birds with one stone.

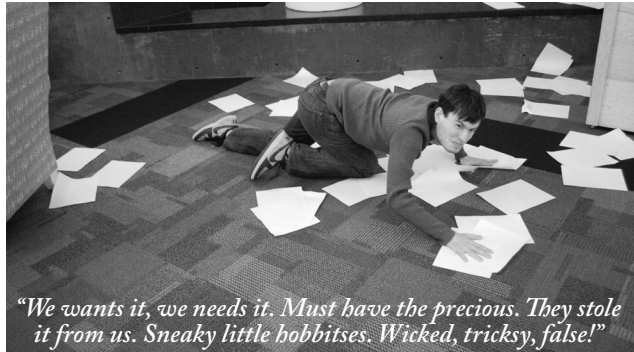
Write your next term paper using font 72. Don't forget to double space!

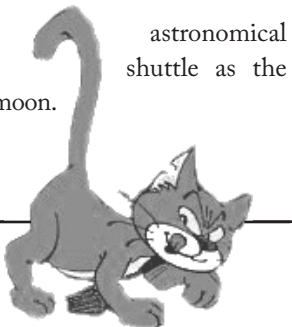
Wall Street, New York
